Akamai Technologies (AKAM) scored a dismal 5% out of a possible 100% score in the authoritative 2025 CPA-Zicklin Index of Corporate Political Disclosure and Accountability <<https://www.politicalaccountability.net/wp-content/uploads/2025/11/2025-CPA-Zicklin-Index.pdf>>

AKAM does not disagree with its dismal 5% score out of a possible 100% score. AKAM also failed to name one small step taken to improve its dismal 5% score although AKAM received this proposal 5 months before the AKAM annual meeting.

This Proposal 8 is a reasonable proposal because it won majority support at 5 major companies in 2025.
