



The Chair of the American Tower (AMT) Governance Committee, Kenneth Frank, deserves against votes

Mr. Kenneth Frank is ultimately responsible for AMT shareholders not having the ability to vote on improving the Political Spending Disclosure at AMT.

AMT could be named to a 2026 Hall of Shame list of companies taking blatant advantage of a new Securities and Exchange Commission policy. AMT took advantage of the new Securities and Exchange Commission policy of giving free ride letters in as fast as 2-days to any company that submits a one-sentence excuse for not including a shareholder proposal in its 2026 annual meeting proxy.

Shareholders at more than 100 companies have voted on the Political Spending Disclosure proposal topic for more than a decade.

AMT scored 31% out of a possible 100% score in the 2025 CPA-Zicklin Index of Corporate Political Disclosure and Accountability
